In the Old Testament, the priests were given specific instructions for how to formulate the anointing oil.

Each element and its inherent characteristics, you will learn, were used in combination as a divine, supernatural resource and technological tool that depicted the presence, power, and provision of God.

I pray through this teaching you will learn to tap into a fresh anointing for your life.

Don't underestimate the divinely-ordained potency of the anointing oil.

It is the natural representation of God's divine idea and intention for our lives and for humanity.

Here's Your Discussion Guide

Read Psalm 45:6-8

From this passage, discuss the significance and power of fragrance.

What is the oil of gladness in reference to here?



Describe what cassias connotes as described in the teaching (reference its meaning in Hebrew).

Read Matthew 25:1-13

Discuss what olive oil represents in this parable.

What do we learn about the unique value of olive oil?

Describe the significance of the number twelve as it relates to the olive tree.

Read Isaiah 24:13-16

Discuss what we learn from this passage about the power of sound.

What is significant about the number five in relation to the number of elements used to formulate anointing oil?

Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13

Discuss why prudence is important.

What is the difference between prudence and wisdom?

Share why cooperation is more important than comprehension.

Read Revelation 19:10

What do we learn from this passage about the importance of worship?

Describe what kind of people God is looking for.
