PART SEVEN DISCUSSION GUIDE

Read Luke 15:11-13

- Where was the prodigal son in his own mind when he came to himself?
- Consider what kinds of things might derail you and what steps you can take to get back on track.
- What did the prodigal son begin to do to take back his personal power?

***Where there is a problem,
there will be a demand on your potential.***

- Describe what characteristics made the prodigal son “prodigal.”
- Explain what happens the moment you take responsibility for your life.

Read Joshua 24:15

- Discuss what this verse tells us we must have.
- What is it your responsibility to do?
- Explain what God wants to give you.
- Describe what gives rise to the expression of potential.

Read Proverbs 16:3

- What was Noah able to do as a result of making God his Chief Advisor?
- What does faith give you the ability to do?
- In what area will people always challenge you?

- Consider how you might elevate your thinking about what’s possible for you.
